- No restrictions on size or number of bags

# \*\*\*\*\*\* NEW LARGE ITEM DROP-OFF \*\*\*\*\*\*

Twice a year in the Spring and fall, to help facilitate seasonal clean-ups, there will be an extra bin to dispose of larger items that will no longer be accepted in the regular garbage bin. (Furniture, mattresses, toilets, rugs, fixtures, sinks, tubs, non-recyclable plastics...)

\* Spring: May 22<sup>nd</sup> & May 25th \* Fall: October 5<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> From 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm

## Items that are not accepted in the garbage bin:

- No Food scraps (we have a composter available for you at the site)
- No Furniture
- No Mattresses
- Nothing with a recyclable symbol
- No construction material (Accepted at Isles-aux- Allumettes)
- No Electronics (Accepted at Isles-aux-Allumettes)
- No Tires (removed from the rim they can be put in the tire pile)
- No Metal
- No Ashes
- No Cat litter
- No Commercial grease

# RECYCLING

## **ACCEPTED MATERIAL**

#### **PAPER**

Newspaper

Coated paper (circulars, magazines)

Office papers

Kraft paper (brown bags)

Envelopes with or without plastic window

Carbon paper

Tissue paper and paper towels

Waxed paper

Food contaminated paper, oil-soaked paper, etc.

Potato bags

#### **CARDBOARD**

Corrugated cardboard (heavy cardboard) (max. dimensions: 1 metre x 0.5 metre) Boxboard and corrugated cardboard (cereal boxes, pizza boxes, etc.) Moulded pulp (egg containers, etc.)

Milk cartons, juice cartons and frozen food boxes

Aluminium lined juice cartons (Tetra-Pak)

Oil-soaked cardboard, paint soaked, cardboard etc.

#### **GLASS**

Lid-free containers and bottles

Tableware

Windows, mirrors and broken glass Light bulb and fluorescent lamps

Fiber glass

Porcelain and ceramic

Pyrex

#### **PLASTICS**

Plastic types 1 through 7 with the exception of # 6

Food product containers

(margarine, yogurt, ice cream, muffins, etc.)

Maintenance product container (dishwashing liquid,

bleach, etc.)

Cosmetic product container (shampoo, cream, etc.)

Plastic lids

Grocery and produce bags

Plastic toys free of any metal parts Earth-free plastic gardening pots

Compact discs, DVD's and cases

Plastic film (e.g., Saran Wrap)

Containers or pieces of Styrofoam

Containers for motor oil, turpentine, gasoline or any

other dangerous goods

Biomedical products (syringes, needles etc.)

Chip bags

Hay Baling bags

Boat shrinks

Styrofoam gardening pots

Garden hose

Bread and milk bags, empty and clean Rope (nylon, clothes line, hay baling, etc.)

Vinyl lap joint

# **METAL**

Tin cans (with or without labels)

Caps or lids
Aluminum beverage cans

Clean aluminum paper or plates

All types of batteries (insert in small clear bag)

Propane tanks

Metal pieces of over 2kg and longer than 60 cm

Metal coat hangers and wire

Paint, stripper or aerosol containers (Place in paint area only)

#### Instructions

- The plastic bags must be gathered and compressed in the same bag.
- Ideally, the plastic caps must remain on the plastic containers.
- It is not necessary to remove the plastic neck from the milk, juice and Tetra Pak type containers.
- All containers must be rinsed out.
- Labels can be left on tin cans and glass containers.
- Residual food must be removed from pizza boxes and other restaurant delivery boxes.
- Fold cardboard boxes to optimize space
